Below is a status update on issues of interest to MTC and the actions that we have taken to date.

President-elect Trump Nominates Department of Transportation Secretary

President-elect Donald Trump has picked former U.S. Representative Sean Duffy (R-WI) as the next U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Secretary. Duffy served on Capitol Hill from 2011 to 2019, serving on the House Financial Services Committee, the Budget Committee, and the Joint Economic Committee during his tenure. In the years since he left Congress, Duffy worked as the co-host of a program on Fox News Business. Duffy did not work on many transportation and infrastructure issues during his time in Congress, so it is unclear what direction he will take the U.S. DOT as its new leader (if confirmed). That said, while in Congress, Duffy voted against the 2015 surface transportation authorization (the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, or FAST Act) and supported an amendment calling for the devolution of the Federal-Aid Highway Program back to the states. As part of the announcement, President-elect Trump mentioned his commitment to making the skies safer and eliminating Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion provisions for pilots and air traffic controllers. In his previous administration, former President Trump focused on highway expansion and rural transportation.
