Recommend the best way forward for BARC to be organized, funded and empowered to serve the Bay Area and fulfill its legislatively mandated role.












#### BARC Current Organizational Structure





#### Initial Stakeholder Findings – General Agreement

- Time is right to do this project
- Clear vision and purpose will show the way
- Collaboration and communication at the regional level is a good thing
- Balance of agency participation, reporting, and funding
- Opportunity for meeting optimization



#### Initial Stakeholder Findings – Areas of Difference

- Spectrum of views on BARC's Intent
  - Ensures collaboration and communication
  - Only one addressing regional climate, overall
  - Important longer-term, bigger picture perspective
  - And more...
- Depth of climate coverage narrow or broad
- Role convener, forum, lead and/or implementer
- Appetite for investment of time and resources




