




Plan Bay Area 2050+: Schedule

How did the Implementation Plan fit into Plan Bay Area 2050?

Plan Bay Area 2050 Document & Final Blueprint





The Plan and Final Blueprint put forward 35 strategies for the region to implement through 2050.

• **Strategies** are high-level policies and/or investments.

Plan Bay Area 2050 Implementation Plan



The Implementation Plan included near-term actions and was included as the final plan chapter.

• Actions were specific and intended to be advanced by MTC and ABAG, often in partnership with others.

Plan Bay Area 2050 Annual Updates



The Implementation Plan was the basis for annual progress updates brought to the MTC Planning Committee & ABAG Administrative Committee.

What components make up the Implementation Plan?

For each of the 35 plan strategies: the Implementation Plan will assess **strategy success factors**, identify the **proposed role** for MTC/ABAG, and determine **specific implementation actions** for MTC/ABAG to take by 2030.

Strategy Assessment

- Each of the plan's 35 strategies is assessed across four strategy success factors:
 - Agency authority
 - Financial resources
 - Public and political support
 - Technical capacity

Implementation Roles

- Determines MTC or ABAG's role in implementing each of the plan's
 35 strategies. Identifies a role as:
 - Lead
 - Partner
 - Support

Implementation Actions


For each strategy, one or more specific actions identify the who, what, where, when and how progress will be made to advance the strategy.

Draft role recommendations and draft actions will come to committees in Summer 2025 in advance of the Draft Implementation Plan release.

Progress from 2022 - 2024

- Launched Doorway, a centralized affordable housing application portal
- Launched Priority Sites and Preservation Pilot Programs, awarding \$45+ million to build and preserve affordable homes.

Implement the Blue Ribbon Transit Recovery Task Force fare integration and payment recommendations

Progress from 2022 - 2024

Deployed Clipper BayPass for businesses and institutions as the region's first all-transit operator pass while the Next Generation Clipper payment system has rolled out.

Plan Bay Area 2050 Implementation Action

Develop a sea level rise funding plan and revamp the Priority Conservation Area (PCA) planning framework using a data driven approach.


Progress from 2022 - 2024

MTC/ABAG and BCDC published the *Sea*Level Rise Funding and Investment
Framework in July 2023 and the *PCA*Refresh in May 2024.

What is different about this Implementation Plan?

The structure and goals remain the same; however, refinements are proposed to make the Implementation Plan more actionable. The goal of these changes is to result in a document that is more:

- Focused Not all action ideas will be included. The aim is for an ambitious and achievable list opposed to a long wish list.
- Responsive Implementation actions will be informed by current challenges and opportunities.
- Measurable Metrics will be integrated into the Implementation Plan to better track progress on a new Vital Signs webpage.

What did we hear at workshops so far?

On September 12th and 18th, over 60 stakeholders contributed input at full-day Plan Bay Area 2050+ workshops.


How feedback from workshops was used:

Staff identified areas that had a high count of suggested changes, and high consensus on the direction of change. MTC/ABAG staff then screened the changes and made draft determinations of where authority, resources, public opinion and staff capacity have shifted significantly in the last three years.

Limited changes are proposed for the Strategy Assessments.

For most strategies, the draft keeps the Assessment the same as Plan Bay Area 2050 (2021).
