Funding Agreement Amendment: Office of the BART Inspector General: Bay Area Rapid
Transit District (\$11,600,000)

### **Subject:**

A request for approval of an amendment to the funding agreement with the Bay Area Rapid Transit District (BART) to increase the funding amount to \$2,100,000 million annually and extend the agreement term five years through FY 2028-29, for a total not to exceed the amount of \$11,600,000, subject to the approval of future BATA budgets.

#### **Background:**

On June 5, 2018, Regional Measure 3 (RM 3) was approved by voters. The legislation that established RM 3, Senate Bill 595 (2017) required formation of the Office of the BART Inspector General ("BART IG") to "ensure that the district makes effective use of bridge toll revenue and other revenue and operates efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable federal and state laws." (Public Utilities Code Section 28840(a)). In 2019, BART established the Office of the BART IG and the Governor appointed the BART Inspector General. Section 28842 of the Public Utilities Code requires BATA to allocate \$1 million in bridge toll revenue for the BART IG. Annual BATA budgets starting with FY2019-20 have included \$1 million for the BART IG. This statute also provides that in the second and subsequent years of operation of the office, BATA may increase the amount of funding allocated for the BART IG to the extent that funds are requested and justified by the BART IG and can be accommodated in BATA's budget.

BART has requested an increase to the annual allocation for the BART IG to cover a staffing level and support budget it believes will allow the BART IG to carry out its mandate, estimated at \$2.7 million annually. The proposed contract amendment will commit BART to budget \$600,000 per year and BATA to budget \$2.1 million per year. For BATA, this is an annual increase of \$1.1 million over the current \$1 million per year allocation, starting in FY 2023-24. This amendment will also extend the funding agreement an additional five years beyond the original term, through the end of FY 2028-29. This amounts to a total increase of \$11.6 million

over the existing funding agreement (an additional \$1.1 million in FY 2023-24 and a five-year extension at \$2.1 million per year).

Future increases to the annual allocation will be considered at BART's request, with the decision on any increase at the sole discretion of BATA.

**Issues:**

**Recommendations:** 

Staff recommends that the Committee authorize the Executive Director or designee to negotiate and enter into an amendment to the funding agreement with BART to increase the annual allocation by \$1,100,000 and extend the agreement period for an additional 5 years, for a total amendment amount not to exceed \$11,600,000, and a new contract amount not to exceed \$16,600,000 to fund ongoing operations of the Office of the BART Inspector General, subject to the approval of future BATA budgets.

Total contract: \$1,000,000 annually for first four years and \$2,100,000

annually for the subsequent six years, for a total not to exceed amount

of \$16,600,000 for the ten-year agreement period, except as increased

by BATA through the BATA budget.

Funding Source: BATA Operating Budget

Fiscal Impact: \$1,100,000 planned to be included in the FY 2023-24 Toll Bridge

Program Operating Budget, subject to approval. Funds for subsequent

years are subject to the approval of future BATA budgets.

Motion by Committee: That the Executive Director or designee is authorized to negotiate and

enter into a funding agreement amendment with BART for operations of the BART Inspector General as described above and in the BATA Oversight Committee Summary Sheet dated June 14, 2023 and that the

Chief Financial Officer is authorized to set aside an additional

\$1,100,000 in FY 2023-24 and \$2,100,000 annually for the subsequent

five years for such amendment, for a total not to exceed \$11,600,000
subject to the approval of future BATA Budgets.
