**Council Leadership Elections**

---

**Subject:**

The Council will select its chair and vice chair pursuant to the process adopted at the March 6, 2026 meeting.

**Background:**

At the March 6, 2026 meeting, the Council approved the election process outlined below. Nominee statements received as of March 26 are included below, and further nominations may be made until voting begins for each leadership position. A chair is required to preside over Council meetings under standard rules of order.

**Proposed Leadership Election Process**

**Nomination Period**

- The nomination period for the current term ending in December 2027 opened at the March 6, 2026 Council meeting and remains open until the leadership votes at the April 3, 2026 meeting.
- Any councilmember may nominate themselves or any other councilmember for the position of chair, vice chair, or both.

**Candidate Materials**

- Candidates may submit a written candidate statement.
- To be distributed to the full Council, written statements must be provided to staff at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which they will be discussed, to meet Brown Act posting requirements.

**Candidate Presentations**

- Each candidate will have up to two minutes to deliver an oral statement prior to the vote for each leadership position.

**Voting Procedures**

- Each Councilmember must state their vote or abstention during a roll-call vote.
- A winning candidate must receive 50% plus one of the eligible members present.
  - For example, with 26 current members, 14 votes constitute the winning threshold (assuming all eligible members are present).
- If more than two candidates are running and no candidate reaches the required threshold, the Council will conduct additional voting rounds, removing the candidate with the fewest votes in each round until a candidate achieves the required majority.

**Candidate Statements:**

Below please find statements from candidates for leadership positions, with Chair candidates followed by Vice Chair candidates, listed in order of submission:

**Carina Lieu (Chair)**

I am excited about the opportunity to be nominated as Chair of the MTC Community Advisory Council at this pivotal moment. As a newly formed body, I bring my experience as Chair from the previous term to provide continuity while helping establish a strong foundation for our work ahead.

In the last term, I brought structure and facilitation to the Council. I understand the recommendations we developed and have a clear sense of what worked well and where we can improve. I see an opportunity to carry that knowledge forward to shape a collaborative, effective, and action-oriented Council.

I am committed to setting this Council up for success through coalition-building, listening, and a focus on making our work impactful and meaningful. I recognize the many ambitions members bring and aim to channel that energy into collective progress.

Importantly, our bylaws establish two terms within this four-year period. I am committed not only to launching this Council successfully, but also to preparing the next wave of leaders to take the helm in approximately 18 months.

I previously served more than two years on the Policy Advisory Council, where I developed a strong understanding of MTC-ABAG processes and how regional decisions move forward.

If selected as Vice Chair, I would focus on three things:

- Supporting effective and well-paced meetings with clear, accessible agendas and materials that help all members engage confidently, regardless of background.
- Ensuring every member feels heard and supported, especially given the range of lived and professional experience represented on this council.
- Strengthening the feedback loop between this body and Commission and Board leadership so our recommendations are clearly communicated, tracked, and responded to in a timely way.
