Member Kinman asked whether the Council will allocate time to create a list of priorities for the incoming group, noting this has been done in the past during transitions.

Director Long responded that it is a good point and worth considering. While the incoming group is a brand-new body, it seems reasonable for the current Council to share recommendations. She suggested adding this to the agenda before the end of the year.

Member Hankerson requested more information about naturally occurring affordable housing, expressing concern that policies such as rent freezes could disproportionately harm small landlords (with 1 to 10 units) compared to large landlords (with 100 or more units). He emphasized that small property owners often operate on limited resources, and restrictive policies could lead to foreclosures, business closures, and ultimately more homelessness.

Director Long clarified that "naturally occurring affordable housing" refers to market-rate housing that is currently affordable without the need for subsidy. Nonprofit developers or public agencies may acquire such housing on the open market and convert it into deed-restricted affordable housing, ensuring long-term affordability. This process does not involve imposing rent restrictions on private landlords.

Member Hankerson acknowledged the clarification but reiterated the importance of discussing broader policy approaches. He suggested exploring models where subsidies are distributed directly to landlords rather than through housing authorities, noting that vacancy rates in the Bay Area present an opportunity to address a significant portion of the housing shortage.

Member Glaser suggested scheduling an educational session where staff could present different techniques and strategies for addressing housing needs. He emphasized the value of informational briefings to broaden the Council's understanding of affordable housing options before engaging in policy discussions.
