Authorization to accept an award of \$4,524,870 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to advance nature-based shoreline adaptation implementation, permitting and governance, and to negotiate and enter into subaward agreements with: East Bay Regional Parks District in an amount not to exceed \$550,000; Save The Bay in amount not to exceed \$780,000; and the East Bay Dischargers Authority in an amount not to exceed \$1,375,000

Background:

The San Francisco Estuary Partnership (SFEP) is one of 28 programs mandated under Section 320 of the Clean Water Act, the National Estuary Program (NEP). SFEP applied for and was awarded \$4,524,870 in funding through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's San Francisco Bay Waer Quality Improvement Fund Grant Program for the project "Pivot Points: Moving Nature-Based Solutions for Water Quality Improvement and Shoreline Adaptation from Planning to Action (Pivot Points). The Pivot Points Project will advance nature-based shoreline (NBS) adaptation implementation, permitting and governance.

The Pivot Points project includes: 1) developing an Implementation Strategy for the Hayward Area Shoreline Master Plan in partnership with the Hayward Area Shoreline Master Plan JPA and the East Bay Regional Parks District; 2) fostering an enabling environment for NBS in the Bay Area through outreach and engagement of elected officials and stakeholders in partnership with Save the Bay, and; 3) design and permitting for the First Mile Horizontal Levee in partnership with the East Bay Dischargers Authority.
