Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN)

Subject:

Approval of a Pre-Qualified Panel of Consultants to Provide Services for the BayREN Codes & Standards and Public Programs

Background:

The Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) implements a portfolio of energy efficiency programs across the region. ABAG serves as the program administrator and lead agency for a 10-member unincorporated association of local government entities. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), in Decision (D.) 12-11-015, first authorized funding for BayREN. Most recently, on July 3, 2023, the CPUC issued D.23-06-055 approving BayREN's Business Plan for eight years (2024-2031) and four-year program portfolio for 2024-2027, with an accompanying budget of approximately \$157 million.

BayREN's Codes & Standards program and two new Public Programs (Integrated Energy Services and Targeted Decarbonization Services) all focus on providing assistance to Bay Area local governments and special districts. To assist with providing that support, ABAG, on behalf of BayREN, issued a RFQ (Request for Qualifications) on January 24, 2024 to establish a bench for consultant assistance in six categories:

- 1. Energy Policy & Reach Code Support
- 2. Compliance Improvement Support
- 3. Energy Concierge Service
- 4. Energy Roadmapping Management
- 5. Decarbonization Showcase Management
- 6. Engineering and Technical Assistance for Public Building Energy Projects

A notice of the RFP was sent via Constant Contact to 5,569 firms. Staff held a Proposer's conference on February 7, which was attended by 21 people, and also posted written responses to questions received during and immediately after the conference. The RFP was downloaded 67 times, and ABAG received qualified submittals from 14 firms, with 6-10 in each category, by the deadline on March 7.

Each proposal for each category was evaluated by two (Categories 1 and 6) or three (Categories 2, 3, 4, and 5) members of a five-person evaluation panel made up of in-house staff and staff from four BayREN member agencies (San Francisco County, San Mateo County, StopWaste, and Sonoma County). In each category, scores were based on the information presented in the submittal related to that particular category of work, not on the general ability or quality of the firm.

The table below shows the final scores for each firm in each category. The evaluation panel recommends that proposals scoring over 70 be selected for the bench in each category, and

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those scores are indicated in bold. This results in at least four and up to eight qualified firms for each category.

Any firms approved in Cycle 1 will be eligible for work throughout the approved term of the bench, which is from the date of Executive Board approval through December 31, 2025, with an option to extend for an additional two years. Selection for entry into a contract with one of the pre-qualified consultants will be undertaken in compliance with MTC's policies and may take place by direct selection or via a mini-procurement. Additional firms may be added to the Bench in response to a re-issuance of the RFQ in later cycles.

Contract periods of performance and amounts will be determined on a per-contract basis. Staff will return to the Executive Board for authorization of any contracts that exceed the Executive Director's signature authority.
