## **Background:**

2023 marked the third summer that MTC and ABAG have sponsored youth summer programs after they were suspended in the summer of 2020 due to budgetary and public health constraints. The Norman Mineta High School Summer Academy provides a multi-week, mostly remote learning curriculum for Bay Area high school students. The Pathways to Government College

**Mentorship** is a targeted effort to develop a pipeline of college-age students who come from

underrepresented backgrounds at the agencies. As the public health advisories lessened, staff

provided the youth with an in-person experience at the Bay Area Metro Center while retaining

This item provides an update on two youth programs supported by MTC/ABAG: the *Pathways*

The number of high school students who completed the program nearly doubled for the second year in a row, from 58 to 113 participants from the summer of 2022 to 2023. The college program also nearly doubled in 2023, after being limited to a handful of students in 2021 and 2022. Recruitment efforts for both programs were focused on encouraging students from Equity Priority Communities (including students with disabilities, and low-income and students of

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color) to apply. All students were paid at living-wage levels (\$25/hour) and provided strongly

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positive feedback on their experiences.

Both programs can grow by enriching the curriculum and expanding recruitment networks to

ensure broader participation from across the Bay Area– an effort that the MTC Council can help

to advance by spreading the word to your communities and networks. Recruitment will go live in

the spring of 2024, including direct outreach to Title I schools in coordination with Council

Chair Campos in San Jose. Staff will email you related materials; your support in sharing these

opportunities with your networks is greatly appreciated. Please contact Ky-Nam Miller if you

would like support conducting additional outreach in your communities.

In addition to existing programs, MTC staff have fielded inquiries from local jurisdictions

seeking support in developing youth pipelines to fulfill expanding opportunities in public

service. Staff will provide an overview of new efforts to meet anticipated workforce demands

from partner transit operators and public agencies.
